TRAINING CENTER GENERAL RULES OF CONDUCT, APPEARANCE AND STANDARDS

- 1. NO GUM CHEWING IS ALLOWED IN THE BULDING AT ANY TIME.

The following thoughts/outline will be how new Dealer training will be conducted at our teaching facility. It will be used by our gaming instructors as a tool/guide in how to introduce a career in the Table Games Department as a Dealer to the candidate; secondly to teach the candidate all the "mechanics" associated with becoming a high performing/procedure orientated Dealer. The gaming school will be run as an actual work area for the instructors and therefore professionalism will be the standard while training is conducted. This is very important when training a new candidate since the "real" casino floor is the same way. We have broken down each week and each day as to what the lessons covered should be but only as a guide for the instructors. The school will have a total of 240 hours of training with 220 hours as the minimum required to graduate. All the games offered at the casino, with the exception of Card Craps, will be taught over the 12 week period:

- 1) Blackjack Shoe 7 weeks
- 2) Blackjack Double Deck 1 week
- 3) Three Card Poker 1 week
- 4) Ultimate Texas Hold'em 1 week
- 5) Four Card Poker 1 week
- 6) Emperor's Challenge Pai Gow 1 week

At the conclusion of each Table game that is taught, the candidate will be required to pass a "Table Audition" with a Manager in the Table Games Department. A grade will be issued on the audition sheet for our records as well as the students file. Once the audition is passed a Certificate/Diploma will be issued to the candidate for their records as well as for their HR files. All Certificates will be signed by a DDA Representative, HR Director, GM and the Table Games Manager. This does not mean immediate transfers will be posted or accepted. Employment in the Table Games Department is contingent on several things:

- 1) Passing an audition in all the games that are taught.
- 2) Applying when part-time Dealer openings are posted in the future.
- 3) Maintaining a good work record in their current department/ be able to obtain a TGA gaming license.
- 4) Selected through an interview process conducted by Table Games Management.
- 5) Tribal member preference.

The training that is being offered is free; therefore it is unpaid training for each candidate. In every other gaming jurisdiction this is usually a very expensive cost for the student since "Gaming Schools" charge a high fee to train someone. So whether an opportunity is available right away to transfer into the Table Games Department or not, going through and passing the course does not go away and can be used anywhere. Some of things that will benefit the Table Games Department and Downstream Casino in training in house Dealers are:

- 1) Training according to our procedures.
- 2) Newly created excitement of learning another trade free of charge at Downstream.
- 3) Good size internal Dealer pool for future vacancies in the department.
